Faculty starting to teach online often aren't sure how to begin...Usually preparation is provided only through workshops or LMS training in things like Blackboard...

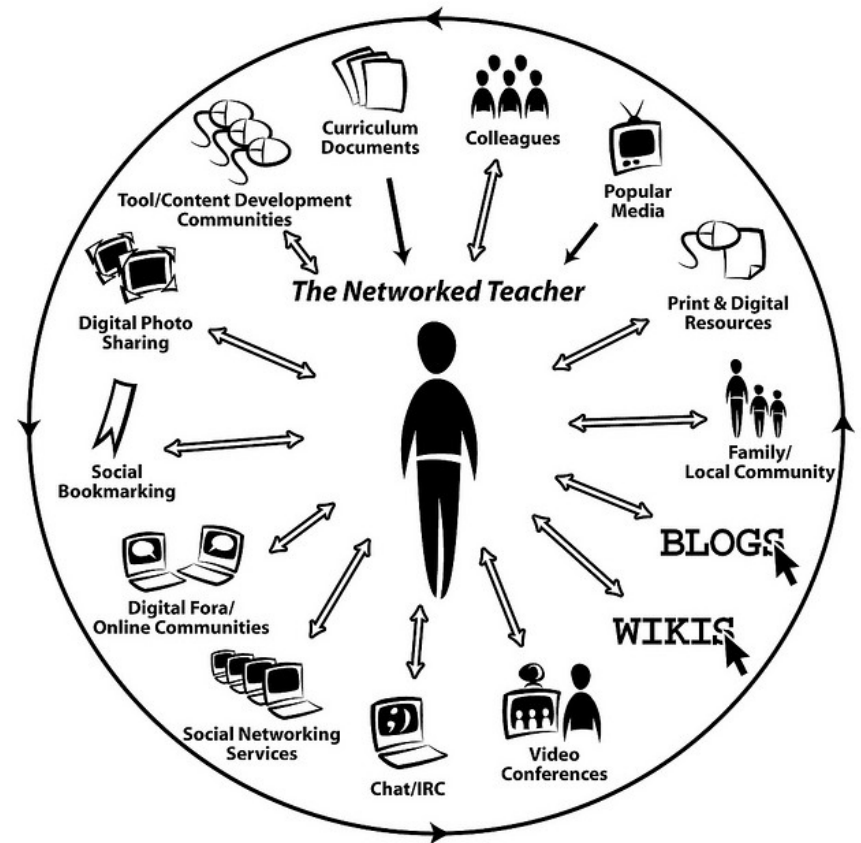


This approach encourages instructors to allow the technology to limit how they teach....
